

It appears that Frederick Capell of High Street, Braunston was an Insurance Agent in 1928 and in April of that year he acquired a used G.M.C. bus registered NR 4997 from G H Moore & Sons of Anstey. This machine originally seated twenty passengers but was downseated to fourteen in March 1927 and presumably seated this number when Capell acquired it in the following year.

If Frederick Capell operated a local bus service from Braunston to either Daventry or Rugby, no information of this has come to light. Maybe the G.M.C. was used solely for private hires. Capell retained the vehicle for three years before disposing of it to a Rugby operator. No doubt the introduction of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 played its part in Capell deciding to cease operations.
