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# JEFFS' COACHES Station Yard HELMDON

This final part of the Jeffs' Coaches story relates to the events of the 21st Century which saw the passing of the firm from being a family owned business to becoming a subsidiary of the Moseley Group of companies under its subsidiary L F Bowen Ltd in 2004 and the subsequent unfortunate collapse of that company in 2012.

The Jeffs' Coaches Group Ltd (3177970) formed in 1996 had changed its name in November 1999 to Jeffs' Coaches Ltd and effectively owned that part of the operation previously held by the late John Jeffs, whilst Ken Jeffs continued with his share as a sole trader under the title of Jeffs' Coaches. On 1st January 2000 Jeffs' Coaches Ltd acquired the whole of the assets, liabilities and trading activity of its two subsidiary companies Basford's Coaches Ltd and Payne's Coaches & Car Hire Ltd together with the fixed assets, related financial loans and trading activity from Ken Jeffs trading as Jeffs' Coaches. Although the entire operation was already totally owned by Ken Jeffs and his wife Rita, this simplified matters by amalgamating the total business into the one company - Jeffs' Coaches Ltd.

The nominal capital of Jeffs' Coaches Ltd was increased by £990,000 beyond the original authorised £10,000 of which 300,000 £1 Shares were issued - 151,328 to Ken Jeffs and 148,672 to Rita Jeffs. In the following year the then defunct companies Basford's Coaches Ltd and Payne's Coaches & Car Hire Ltd were liquidated.

On 1st January 2000 Jeffs' Coaches Ltd recorded some 87 buses and coaches on its books. It may be recalled that since the untimely death of partner John Jeffs in 1995 the fleet had reduced from a little over one hundred vehicles to the current level by the end of the twentieth century. In the millennium year, however, Ken Jeffs maintained the fleet size by acquiring six secondhand buses and coaches whilst dispensing with six others.

In January 2000 four 1996 Volvo B10M-62s mounted with Jonckheere Deauville fifty-three seat coach bodies were bought from dealer Yeates of Loughborough and these carried the registrations N802/3/7 and 8 NHS. Initially a pair of Caetano bodied Volvos -

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 $\rm L36/7~CAY$  - were traded in part exchange but later in the year a further couple of Volvo coaches were dispensed with.

Unfortunately one of Jeffs' Leyland Olympians bought from City of Oxford in the previous year was damaged in an accident and considered beyond economic repair. In fact two similar Olympians were then bought from City of Oxford in March 2000 and these carried the registrations VJO 204X and WWL 207X. The sixth vehicle taken out of service in 2000 was a former Willoughby & Harris DAF minibus bearing the index G933 JKY.



The four Volvo B10Ms carrying Jonckheere Deauville bodywork were smart looking coaches as can be seen from this view of N807 NHS. They were however retained in the Jeffs' fleet for no more than a couple of years.



VJO 204X was one of the pair of Leyland Olympians with Eastern Coach Works seventy-five seat dualdoor bodies that Jeffs' acquired from City of Oxford Motor Services Ltd in March 2000 and very smart it looked in Jeff's white and green livery.

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Incidentally Jeffs' Coaches continued to use the Almex ticketing system on local bus services as they had for quite a number of years.

The year 2000 ended on a high note for Jeffs' Coaches as in October the firm was named the best international operator in the business, being presented with the *Group Leisure* magazine's industry award for best "UK coach operator for European and International Tours 2000". This was just one of many awards won by the Jeffs' team.

For the first time for several years Ken Jeffs felt able in 2001 to invest in a significant number of new coaches with which to upgrade his fleet. Accordingly eight new Iveco EuroRider 391E chassis were purchased and mounted with attractive Beulas Stergo coach bodies seating either forty-nine or fifty-one passengers. All had toilet compartments. Six were delivered to Helmdon in May 2001 when they were registered Y804 - 9 YBC and the other two arrived in November as FE51 RHO/RHU. The only other coach to be taken into stock during 2001 was W315 RVO which was a Plaxton Paragon bodied Volvo B10M fifty-three seater which was hired from Volvo Coach Sales between September 2001 and February 2002.



The Spanish coachbuilder Beulas produced good-looking bodywork for fitment to Iveco EuroRider chassis as can be seen from this illustration of Y806 YBC.

Representing the two Iveco/Beulas coaches carrying the then new (in 2001) registrations is FE51 RHO.

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The intake of eight new coaches however saw the disposal of some twenty older stock. The majority of the outgoing vehicles were quite elderly time-expired machines but six mid-life "N" registered Volvos also passed to dealers to help pay for the new machinery. Overall the fleet reduction for 2001 was in the region of 12% which brought the total down to 76 buses and coaches at the year end.

The year 2002 started disastrously for Jeffs' Coaches as at 2.30am on Sunday 13th January the firm was the victim of an arson attack in which eight coaches were totally destroyed and the perpetrator was never held to account. Lost were two of the Iveco/Beulas coaches new in the previous twelve months and these were Y804 YBC and FE51 RHU. Also a good Volvo B10M/Caetano Algarve coach registered P180 ANR went up in flames together with a similar but somewhat older model registered XWG 254 (originally G913 WAY). The other four coaches fired were Leyland Leopards EWW 206T and YFC 16V and Bedford YMTs NBD 304/7V.

Fortunately January was not the busiest time of year for Jeffs' Coaches and the loss of seven vehicles did not cause as much disruption as would have been the case in the summer months. However, two Volvo B10M coaches with Van Hool Alizee fifty-three seat bodies were immediately hired from Volvo Coach Sales but these in effect only replaced two Jonckheere Deauville bodied Volvos that returned to a dealer at the same time. The two incoming machines were registered R399 EOS and R413 EOS and it is believed they remained with Jeffs' until April 2002.

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On the left is R413 EOS and on the right is R399 EOS, the two Volvo B10Ms with Van Hool coachwork hired by Jeffs' Coaches following an arson attack.

In March 2002 a pair of Volvo B10Ms sporting Jonckheere Jubilee P50 bodies seating fifty-one passengers were sourced from a dealer to replace stock lost in the fire. The registrations carried by this pair were A348 SCW and A539 BEC and both quickly had their seating capacity uplifted to fifty-five in August 2002. Both coaches had previously been operated by Shaw Hadwin of Carnforth. A month later a former Jeffs' Volvo B10M/ Jonckheere Deauville bodied coach that had been traded in to a dealer the year before was repurchased and this was registered N670 HSC.



A348 SCW was a Volvo B10M with Jonckheere Jubilee bodywork that came to Jeffs in "dealer" white livery in March 2002. Initially just fleetname transfers were applied and the coach had to wait some months to have its red and green stripes applied.

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The second Volvo B10M/ Jonckheere Jubilee P50 bought in March 2002 was A539 BEC. This vehicle did receive its full livery early in Jeffs' ownership.



The final coaches acquired to replace fire losses were a quartet of former City of Oxford Volvo B10Ms with Jonckheere Deauville bodies each seating fifty-three persons. These seven-year-old coaches were registered M627-30 FNS in the Oxford fleet but were immediately allocated cherished registrations by Jeffs' Thus M627-30 FNS became 802 AOJ, 112 AXN, 3493 CD and XWG 254 respectively in the Jeffs' fleet.



112 AXN was the Volvo B10M/Jonckheere Deauville previously registered M628 FNS and it is seen here at the Helmdon Depot.

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Sister Volvo/Jonckheere Deauville M627 FNS became 802 AOJ with Jeffs' and was photographed leaving Banbury Bus Station.

During the year 2002 Jeffs' Coaches required additional double-deck vehicles for use on school contracts and in May purchased three more Leyland Olympians with Eastern Coach Works bodies. These former Lancashire vehicles were registered SCK 225/6X and DBV 137Y. The first of the three had coach seating for fifty-two passengers whilst the other two were equipped with bus seats for seventy-seven people

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Sister Leyland Olympian DBV 137Y was a year younger than the SCX registered motors.



As the summer of 2002 approached Jeffs' Coaches bought a Volvo B10M with Jonckheere Mistral 50 coachwork and hired three sister vehicles. The four coaches were registered T713 / 719 / 726 and 729 UOS with T729 UOS being the motor that was bought. The other three remained on hire until some time between May 2004 and May 2005 when they too were purchased.



The four Volvo B10Ms with Jonckheere Mistral bodies hired and/or later purchased by Jeffs' Coaches were indeed handsome machines as can be seen in this photograph of T713 UOS.

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This time an offside view of T726 UOS, one of the four Jonckheere Mistral 50 bodied Volvo B10Ms taken into Jeffs' fleet during 2002.

Just two more vehicles were acquired by Jeffs' during 2002, the first of which was a seven-year-old Toyota with Caetano Optimo III coachwork seating just twenty-one passengers and registered WPX 852. This arrived in June and was followed in October by a Plaxton Premiere 350 bodied Volvo B10M previously operated in Eire and registered R620 BAY when bought by Jeffs' Coaches.

This Toyota with twenty-one seat Caetano Optimo III coachwork registered WPX 852 started life as M844 LFP.



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During 2002 Jeffs' withdrew another four older vehicle from its stock which gave a year end total fleet of 77 buses and coaches which was two up on the previous year.

On the subject of rolling stock a pair of Volvo B10Ms with Plaxton Premiere 350 bodies seating forty-six passengers made a brief appearance in the Jeffs' fleet for the summer of 2003 when R403/4 FWT were acquired from Volvo Coach Sales in April but they were returned to Volvo at the end of the season in September. It seems likely that these coaches were hired rather than purchased. At the same time five similar vehicles but seating forty-eight passengers were hired from Volvo registered W606/7/33/5/6/FUM. With the exception of W606 FUM the rest of these former Wallace Arnold coaches were purchased at some point between May 2004 and May 2005.



All the "W-FUM" registered former Wallace Arnold Volvo B10Ms came to Jeffs' in the cream livery shown in this photograph and were operated in this colour for some time. W606 FUM with its Plaxton Premiere 350 coachwork is featured here.

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When this photograph of W633 FUM was taken in April 2005 Jeffs' fleet livery had been applied.

The five "W-FUM" coaches entering the fleet displaced nine older machines which represented a loss of four vehicles bringing the total down to 73 at the year end.

No new vehicles were bought during 2004 but three were purchased secondhand and a further eight were either hired or demonstrated to Jeffs' Coaches. Dealing first with the machines that were acquired secondhand, a pair of Marshall bodied Dennis Dart thirty-six seater buses were bought from City of Oxford Motor Services Ltd in the summer mainly for use on local bus services. These Darts were registered M505 VJO and M517 VJO and they gave Jeffs' three year's service.



M505 MJO was placed in service by Jeffs' Coaches still in its City of Oxford livery but with Jeffs' transfers applied. This Marshall bodied Dennis Dart awaits departure from Buckingham on the 32 service to Milton Keynes on 13th July 2004.

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Marshall bodied Dennis Dart M517 VJO was photographed at Helmdon on 15th August 2004 in all-over while livery pending the application of stripes and logos. As can be seen, these Darts were dual-doored versions.

The third vehicle bought secondhand during 2004 was a Van Hool Alizee bodied Volvo B10M which could accommodate fifty-one passengers. It was registered SIL 3924 and was twenty-one years old when purchased but was put to good use for a year.



This Van Hool bodied Volvo B10M registered SIL 3924 certainly did not look its age when acquired by Jeffs' Coaches.

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Moving on to the eight vehicles hired during 2004 the first one in April was a Mercedes-Benz midibus with a Wright Nimbus body that came from Messrs Pickford of Chippenham and registered WCZ 4915. For reasons now unknown it was returned to Pickford's during the same month and replaced by another Mercedes but this time with an Alexander Belfast thirty-three seat body. This was M412 BEY and it was retained by Jeffs' for over two years. In May 2004 a trio of Volvo B10Ms with Van Hool Alizee fortynine seat bodies were hired for the summer season, probably from Volvo Coach Sales. These carried the registrations N445/470/527 PYS. Also in May HX53 ODH which was a Transbus Dart was demonstrated to Jeffs' but nothing further developed from this demonstration. Finally, in the Autumn, a Dennis Javelin with Caetano Algarve II coachwork registered N592 GBW and a Volvo B10M with Caetano Enigma bodywork registered X391 RBD were leased from a Dealer to cover a temporary requirement for additional coaches.



M412BEYwasMercedes-Benz 811D with fitted Belfastbuilt Alexander bodywork that was hired by Jeffs' Coaches from Pickford's Chipofpenham for almosttwo-and-a-half years.

Jeffs' Coaches operated many Caetano Algarve bodied Dennis Javelins or Volvo B10Ms so that Javelin N592 GBW that was hired during the Autumn of 2004 fitted well into the vehicle stock.



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Counting the hired rolling stock, the intake of eleven vehicles during 2004 witnessed the demise of eighteen others, which served to reduce the fleet by another seven buses to give a year-end total fleet of 66 machines.

Probably the worst accident to have occurred in the history of Jeffs' Coaches happened on Monday 24th May 2004. Jeffs' Volvo B58 registered RHE 992X was returning pupils home from the Blessed George Napier Roman Catholic School in Banbury when on the narrow B4100 road between Souldern in Oxfordshire and Aynho in Northamptonshire it collided with a tractor and trailer ripping part of the side out of the coach. One boy was killed and another had a serious arm injury. At least eighteen pupils were hurt but most had minor injuries. The Volvo coach RHE 992X was scrapped following the accident. Fortunately fatal accidents involving school buses are very rare but nonetheless devastating when they do occur.

In June 2004 Ken Jeffs reached the age of 72 years and he was anxious to secure the future of the business as neither his son nor daughter were interested in running Jeffs' Coaches as both had their own careers to follow. With a fleet of over sixty vehicles the business was likely to be of interest only to the larger well-established regional coach operators and so it was that agreement was reached with L F Bowen Ltd, the wholly-owned subsidiary of Moseley Group (PCV) plc of Loughborough to acquire the entire share capital, including all assets, of Jeffs' Coaches Ltd on 8th December 2004.

Bowen's were based in Tamworth and in the past few years had acquired both York Bros (Northampton) Ltd and Appleby's Coach Holidays in Lincolnshire. The intention was to operate Jeff's Coaches as a separate company within the Bowen's Group and it was agreed that Ken Jeffs would stay on as a Director to ensure continuity.

Following acquisition by the Bowen Group very few new vehicles were allocated to Jeffs' Coaches but inter-company transfers between the various Bowen subsidiaries were commonplace. During 2005 four Bova Futuras each seating forty-nine passengers were transferred during February from Bowen's Tamworth fleet to Jeffs' Coaches. These were all over ten years old and registered ECZ 9144, GLZ 6557 and K298/9 GDT. The latter two were quickly re-registered as OUI 2298 and XIL 5299 respectively. All were in Bowen's standard pale metallic livery which in some lights looked gold and in others silver! They were also adorned with a sun and multi-coloured ribbons and this livery henceforth replaced Jeffs' former colours on repaint. The Bowen group of companies operated their own coach holiday programmes under the *Door-to-Door* banner under which patrons were conveyed on feeder services, often by minibus, to and from their homes and convenient pick-up points on the various tours.

Between May and August 2005 three coaches were transferred to Jeffs' from York Bros of Northampton. All three dated from 1988 and were thus about seventeen years old when cascaded and all three were Volvo B10Ms. The coachwork varied from Plaxton Paramount 3200 via Paramount 3500 to Van Hool Alizee and were respectively registered LUI 7871, OUI 3918 and OUI 3914.

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ECZ 9144 was one of four Bova Futura coaches imported into the Jeffs' fleet from Bowen's during 2005 and all four were retained for a couple of years.

The Bova Futura originally registered K299 GDT when transferred to Jeffs' was re-registered XIL 5299 by Bowen's.



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LUI 7871 was the low-height Plaxton Paramount 3200 bodied Volvo B10M that Jeffs' Coaches inherited from York Bros of Northampton.



The high floor Plaxton Paramount 3500 bodied Volvo B10M incoming to Jeffs' from York Brothers was OUI 3918. With Bowen's having a standard livery only the company name and logo transfers needed changing.

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The third offering from the York Bros fleet was OUI 3914 which was the Van Hool Alizee bodied Volvo B10M. Jeffs' retained the above three coaches until late in 2012.

Jeffs' Coaches needed a couple of double-deckers for school contracts to replace older models that had fallen by the wayside. Accordingly in April 2005 a pair of former Go Northern Leyland Olympians were sourced. These seventy-seven seater Eastern Coach Works bodied machines were registered C649 LJR and C660 LJR and both operated in their Go Northern liveries for quite a long time.



Leyland Olympian C649 LJR still sported its Go Northern livery a year Jeffs' Coachesafterit.This bought waspossibly a sign that under managementattention was being paid to the appearance of the fleet?

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Sister Eastern Coach Works bodied Leyland Olympian C660 LJR was caught by the camera passing Brackley's Market Square in June 2006.

A month after acquiring the two Go Northern Leyland Olympians a Volvo B6 was purchased that had also been in the Go Northern fleet. This was L408 GDC, a Plaxton Pointer forty-seat version of the B6.

In addition to the vehicle movements described above, during 2005 Jeffs' Coaches saw the return to the fleet of N789 SJU, a Volvo B10M with Caetano Algarve II coachwork after an absence of four years. Also a further Mercedes-Benz 811D was hired from Pickford's of Chippenham for the summer period and this UVG Citistar bodied motor

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registered N253 PGD seated thirty-three. Upon its return to Chippenham in September 2005 it was replaced by Pickford's with M799 EUS, also a Mercedes-Benz 811D, but this time with Wadham-Stringer thirty-three seat bodywork. Finally for 2005 a Toyota fitted with Caetano Optimo II coachwork seating twenty-two passengers and registered V359 POB was transferred from Bowen's Tamworth operation to Jeffs' Coaches.



A rear view of the Wadham-Stringer bodied Mercedes-Benz 811D registered M799 EUS can be seen here at Jeffs' Buckingham base. It remained with Jeffs' for only four months.



This Caetano Optimo II bodied Toyota was transferred to Jeffs' Coaches in the Autumn of 2005 but V359 POB did not have Jeffs' logos applied immediately.

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Unusually in 2005 the year-end fleet strength recorded an increase of four vehicles to a total of 70 although that did not necessarily indicate that the operational requirement had increased as frequently buses and coaches delicensed for disposal were not actually sold within the same year. Jeffs' Coaches usually amassed a collection of redundant rolling stock at the Helmdon yard prior to disposing of everything to scrap dealer Wigley of Carlton.

The Jeff's Coaches fleet profile was not changed a great deal during 2006. In January the Wadham-Stringer bodied Mercedes-Benz 811D was returned to Messrs Pickford of Chippenham who replaced it with M411 BEY, an Alexander Belfast bodied Mercedes, also on hire. On the coach front a former Wallace Arnold Volvo B10M equipped with Plaxton Paragon coachwork and registered ESK 897 was transferred from the York Brothers' Northampton fleet.



Volvo B10M ESK 897 was imported into the Jeffs' Coaches fleet from Bowen's Cogenhoe based York Bros operation and very handsome it looked too!

May 2006 saw an ADL E300 sixty-seater bus demonstrated to Jeffs' Coaches for about a week but no orders resulted from this demonstration. The two Alexander Belfast bodied Mercedes-Benz 811Ds on hire from Pickford's - M411/2 BEY - were returned to their owner in September 2006. In June 2006 the former Basford's Coaches Greens Norton depot was closed and remaining operations transferred to Helmdon. The total fleet at the end of 2006 was two less than in 2005 and stood at 68 vehicles.

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Not only did Jeffs' Coaches not receive any new or secondhand coaches during 2007 it lost the four Bova Futura machines that Bowen's had allocated just two years earlier. With six other older vehicles being disposed of the fleet strength for 2007 reduced by ten motors to a total of 58 vehicles.

In the following year - 2008 - Bowen's did allocate two new Volvo B12B coaches to the Jeffs' fleet. Both had Plaxton Panther bodies with YN08 NWV seating forty-nine passengers and having a toilet compartment and YN58 CGE seating fifty-three and having no toilet facilities.

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Jeffs' also saw the return from Bowen's of one of its former Volvo B10M coaches mounted with Plaxton Premiere 350 coachwork. This was WBN 106 which had been re-registered since leaving Jeffs' in 2004 having previously been W606 FUM. The three incoming coaches in 2008 were counteracted by the loss of four of the Beulas bodied Ivecos bought new in 2001. In addition another two Caetano Algarve bodied coaches were also dispensed with, reducing the year-end fleet total to 55 vehicles.

Sadly Ken Jeffs died suddenly on 29th January 2008 and his wife Rita did likewise just two years later on 20th April 2010 and thus the Jeffs family connection with the coaching firm bearing their name was finally severed.

By August 2008 Bowen's had closed the Buckingham base of Jeffs' Coaches and transferred the remaining operations to Helmdon, after which time just the main depot and that at Witney remained.

The last few years of Jeffs' Coaches covering the years 2009 to 2012 continued the gradual decline of the firm in terms of vehicle numbers but not necessarily in financial viability. No more new vehicles were allocated and just three coaches were transferred from Bowen's main fleet to Jeffs'. In 2009 an Irizar bodied Scania registered OVS 822 moved from Tamworth to Helmdon whilst in 2011 a pair of three-year-old Volvo B12B Plaxton Panther coaches were allocated to Jeffs', one of them replacing a similar vehicle already in use. The two incoming Volvos were registered YN08 OWF and OWG whilst the outgoing coach was YN08 NWV.



The Scania K113 Irizar Century bodied coach transferred from Bowen's to Jeffs' was OVS 822 which had originally carried the registration P388 WWL. Another Scania/Irizar combination was demonstrated to Jeffs' in October 2010.



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During the same period from 2009 to 2012 the fleet was reduced by a further thirteen buses and coaches - six in each of the years 2009/10 and YN08 NWV as mentioned above in 2011. Sadly, late in October 1912 the Bowen Travel Group of Companies went into liquidation. Almost immediately, on 2nd November 2012, the Jeffs' business was sold by the administrators as a going concern to King Long UK Ltd of Coventry who set up a new company named "Jeffs Travel Ltd, but that is another story! At least the trauma of redundancy for many of the local staff was dissipated.
